"THE LOCK AND DOOR"

Dark Comedy, Full-length 2M, 2W

They bait their friends, Ronald and Julie, into enacting a social experiment to achieve a more complex romantic connection and, in doing so, unravel Ronald and Julie's marriage.

"HIGHLIGHTS IN HOLLYWOOD"

Inspired by Wittgenstein's *Tractatus Logico Philosophicus* and Wittgenstein's favorite 1940's detective novel, *Sally's in the Alley. Highlights in Hollywood* comes to life as the narrator re-imagines the first scene from the book through the framework of Wittgenstein's ideas about the interdependence of objects and their contexts. Two government men deliver a telegram to Doan, a private eye, and his sidekick Carstairs, a frighteningly large Great Dane. Orders from Washington say the detective team is to set out on a journey through the Mojave Desert to find a wanted man named Dust Mouth Haggarty.

"THE ONLY GIRL IN THE HOT TUB"

Dark Comedy, Full-length 4M, 4W Flexible Set

On a still New Mexican morning, within the dim corridors of El Sangre Fitness, Swim and Racquet Club, the adolescent employees greet and check in their guests. Tenth-grader Annie soaks in the hot tub in her black bikini while Ray, who has just gotten out of jail on a DWI charge, keeps a friendly watch over her. And the lawyer and judge prepare for their workouts. This comedy-drama follows adults in power and the youth they are meant to look after. It ponders the implications of seemingly insignificant oversights by those in charge.

"KOSONOM"

A young woman wanders into the office of the Hungarian railroad at 3 a.m. to ask when the next train will arrive. The railroad man offers the young woman his bed until the train comes at 6 a.m.

"MAGGIE AND JIMMY"
Dark Comedy, 10 Minutes
2M, 1W
Flexible Set

This short, surreal piece examines the nature of abandonment and lost love. On a dusty road, Jimmy confronts Maggie --- who has recently stolen Jimmy's organs out of his body --- and pleads with her to return them. Since Maggie's departure, she's become attached to a little boy in search of his mother. She refuses to release the boy's hand or to give Jimmy back his stomach, intestines, and oesophagus.

"PROWLERS IN THE NIGHT"

One-Act Drama 4M, 3W Flexible Set

Girl, a senior in high school, finds herself romantically entangled with her next-doorneighbour's father, a disenchanted veteran who, due to a bullet wound, has lost all feeling in his left arm. Set in present-day, *Prowlers in the Night* charts *Girl's* coming of age in a sprawling desert town as her neighbour's dog goes missing and the summer heat rises.

"THE WAITER"

One-Act Drama 2M, 2W Flexible Set

Set in the studio apartment of a restless twenty-three year old server, this play follows *Waiter* as he bleaches the walls of his apartment to erase the smoke stains from the previous year. His visitors include the hostess, the bar regular, and his mother --- who comes by to drop off a carton of *American Spirits*.
